Exploded on 1 July 1916 to signal the opening of the Battle of the Somme, the detonation of the Lochnagar mine created a massive crater, still visible on satellite images, and what was then the largest manmade sound in history.

Richard has owned the Lochnagar Crater since 1978. In this fascinating talk, discover the history behind the crater's existence and its impact on both the war and the landscape to this day.

This vast wound on the battlefield is preserved as a memorial to those men and women of all nations who fell in the Great War and is dedicated to peace, forgiveness and reconciliation. It is now a place of pilgrimage for over 200,000 visitors each year.
